2006 CCHD NATIONAL GRANT RECIPIENTS

Total = \$90,000.00 awarded 6-15-06

Center for Participatory Change – Asheville (\$30,000): Organizing for Racial Justice.

Winston-Salem Sponsoring Committee (\$35,000): Communities Helping All Neighbors Gain Empowerment (CHANGE).

NC Latino Coalition – Raleigh (\$25,000): Dedicated to building power among low income Latino immigrants to change state policies and structures.

2006 CCHD LOCAL GRANT RECIPIENTS

Total = \$42,000.00 awarded 4-1-06

The Arc of Union County Inc. (FAIR Play) – Monroe (\$4,695): Transportation for low-income family participation in developmentally appropriate activities.

Centro Latino of Caldwell County Inc. (Immigrant Services) – Lenoir (\$4,500): Assisting Spanish-speaking clients with transportation and access to services.

Christians for a United Community (Advocacy Project) – Asheville (\$5,000): community organizing addressing affordable public transportation and a living wage.

Hispanic Youth and Young Adult Ministry (National Encounter) – Diocesan-wide (\$5,000): Participation by low-income Spanish-speaking/bilingual youth and young adults.

Neighborhood Family Resource Center (After school and summer programs) – Charlotte (\$5,000): Homework assistance, tutorial enrichment, special projects and fieldtrips for low-income youth – ages 5 to 12.

Neighbors in Ministry (Rise and Shine Summer Freedom School) – Brevard (\$5,000): Summer activities for low-income African-American and Hispanic K-8 children utilizing an Integrated Reading Curriculum.

Pigeon Community Development Center (Enrichment Tutoring) – Waynesville (\$5,000): Homework assistance, tutoring and library and computer lab use for low-income neighborhood children.

Qualla/Swain Families First (Sid a ne lv a gv yi) – Cherokee (\$1,250): Pairing faith teams with Work First families who are striving to move out of poverty and to become self-sufficient.

Saint Peter's Homes Inc. (Support Services) – Charlotte (\$5,000): Case management support for peer leadership of the residential association and of recreational activities.

Seeds for Habitat – Albemarle (\$555): Supplies for assisted living center residents to sort and pack seeds.

We Care Planning Committee of Ashe County (Garden Seed Program) – Warrensville (\$1,000): Helping low-income families develop food security.
