- Centro de Enlace – Burnsville** (\$3,500): Supplemental transportation to enable community members to get to and from work and medical appointments.
- Centro Latino of Caldwell County Inc. – Lenoir** (\$2,000): Providing Spanish language interpretation for health clinics and emergency assistance programs.
- Coalición de Organizaciones Latino-Americanas (COLA) - Asheville** (\$3,000): Regional network of Latino community groups in western North Carolina.
- Community Empowerment Project – Forest City** (\$2,500): Computer lab and training for low-wealth citizens.
- Helping Empower Local People (HELP) 'One Charlotte' Project – Charlotte** (\$2,000): Assisting immigrants with civic engagement, naturalization and voter registration.
- Hinton Rural Life Center (Gifts of Kindness Project) – Hayesville** (\$1,000): Distributing basic household products to low-wealth families in far western North Carolina counties.
- Hispanic Learning Center (ESL Tutoring Program) – Concord** (\$2,000): Addressing the language gap between English and non-English speaking students.
- Hospitality House of Boone (Homeless Life Skills Project) – Boone** (\$2,000): Providing computer lab and internet service training.
- Just Economics (Living Wage Business Certification Program) – Asheville** (\$2,000): Identifying and promoting area Living Wage businesses.
- Montagnard Dega Association (MDA) Employment Readability Project – Greensboro** (\$3,000): Assistance with job application and interviewing skills.
- Muchos Amigos Nunca Olvidan Servir (MANOS) Hispanic community services – Boone** (\$2,000): Providing a central location for referrals to community services.

- Smoky Mountain Vicariate Hispanic Ministry (Institute for Human Development) – Smoky Mountain region** (\$2,000): Groundwork for leadership training and developing communication skills.
- St. Andrew the Apostle Parish (Hispanic Outreach Program) – Mars Hill** (\$2,000): Cross-cultural educational and social activities.
- Stecoah Valley Arts Center (Artisan's Gallery) – Robbinsville** (\$1,000): Promoting economic development among local artisans.
