Burnsville Land Community - Burnsville (\$25,000): Maintaining long-term affordable manufactured housing.

Helping Empower Local People (HELP) - Charlotte (\$40,000): Expanding empowerment activities to Northern Mecklenburg County.

St. Peter's Homes Inc. (Support Services) - Charlotte (\$1,000): Clinical assistant activities to increase resident participation in community.

Centro Comunitario Hispano-Americano - Brevard (\$2,120): Providing professional instruction for Latino women in crafts made for resale to augment their income.

Zacchaeus House - Asheville (\$3,000): Organizing and educating people living in poverty to create social change and improve their lives.

Swannanoa Pride Community Coalition - Swannanoa (\$1,300): Organizing residents through community meetings to increase their voice in local government and planning for the future.

Greensboro Catholic Habitat Build - Greensboro (\$2,000): Four parishes working together to construct a Habitat for Humanity home.

Housing Greensboro Home Repair Program - Greensboro (\$500): Working toward elimination of substandard housing.

Hurlbert Johnson Friendship House - Murphy (\$5,000): Providing temporary housing to homeless individuals in Western North Carolina and improving their quality of life.

Appalachian Heritage Crafters - Murphy (\$1,500): Teaching and preserving local Appalachian crafts to promote economic and social benefits to area residents.

Perpetual Health - Community Supported Family Medicine - Franklin (\$3,000): Non-profit, community-supported family medical practice serving the uninsured.

Newborns in Need - Pfafftown (\$2,000): Providing healthcare and hygiene supplies for babies in crisis due to health problems or poverty.

Save the Montagnard People - Asheboro (\$1,500): Helping Montagnard people assimilate into the United States while retaining their culture.

Burnsville Land Community - Burnsville (\$5,000): Maintaining long-term affordable manufactured housing.

Montagnard Dega Association - Greensboro (\$2,000): Providing refugees with needed skills to gain self-sufficiency through permanent employment.

Seigle Avenue Partners Freedom School - Charlotte (\$500): Offering low-income children literacy-based summer camping experience.

Centro de Enlace Tortilleria El Progreso - Burnsville (\$2,500): Working with a community cooperative to promote stable jobs for the Latino community.

Coalicion de Organizaciones Latino-Americanas (COLA) - Asheville (\$2,500): Network encouraging Latino community groups and leaders to learn, strategize and raise a collective voice about common issues.

Smoky Mountain Vicariate Hispanic Ministry - Franklin (\$2,500): Providing ESL, Computer skills and literacy training for Hispanics in Haywood County.

Tabernacle Enrichment Corporation - Asheville (\$1,300): After-school homework instruction and tutoring.

St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic Church - Mars Hill (\$1,500): Hispanic Outreach Program.

Pigeon Community Development Center - Waynesville (\$1,000): After School Tutoring Program.
